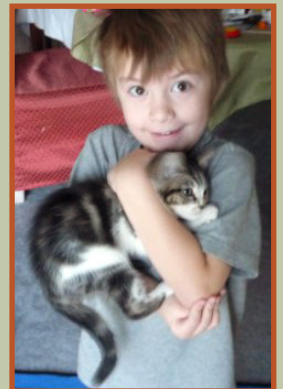

THOUGHTS

BECOMING CONSCIOUS BY REV. SHARON LEE FOLEY

In this **Science of Mind philosophy**, we teach that there is Something, that is everything, expressing Itself in, through and as all of Its creation. This means that each one of us is an individualized expression of this Something. For simplicity's sake, I call it God. We teach, as Ernest Holmes wrote in *What We Believe*, that "...heaven is within us and...we experience it to the degree that we become conscious of it." For me, the practice of this teaching is becoming conscious of it.

This year's theme is "Spiritual Evolution–Personal Revolution" and I don't think one can occur without the other. Becoming conscious of our oneness in God requires a spiritual evolution, an unfolding, a change in direction in how we view ourselves and who we are. Our personal revolution, then, is the fundamental way we revise our view of ourselves, each other and the world. Most of us cannot accomplish this by simply deciding to do so. It requires a real commitment to our own evolution and a revolution in consciousness.

One way to do this is by developing and nurturing our own spiritual practice by partnering with God through prayer and meditation. Another is by taking classes, reading and seeking out other seekers – all the while remembering that what we are seeking is seeking us. We are the body of God. We are how God whispers, "I am here. I love you." That's worth evolving into, isn't it?

Just a brief note to update everyone on our finances and attendance. We ended 2012 with strong attendance of our holiday and end-of-year services. We actually broke some attendance records for both Christmas Eve and the Golden Bowl services. It's great to see so many people attending these special holiday celebrations.
