OVERCOMING THE ODDS BY JUNE GUMZ



Spiritual economics is an interesting term, don't you think? Seems almost contradictory in a way. The word "spiritual" is from the latin "spritulis" which means "of breathing." It means having the nature of Spirit or God. Very ethereal. Whereas "economics" is a science dealing with producing, distributing and using stuff or services. The word economics is also defined as the condition of a group as it relates to material prosperity. That's not very ethereal.

We have been using a book by Eric Butterworth, *Spiritual Economics*, for the past several weeks as a basis for Sunday Talks as well as a class Reverend Larry has been teaching. The book is used often in Centers for Spiritual Living. I think as a reminder of the basic teaching of Science of Mind, which is that there is only one life – literally. The breath of God breathes everything, everyone, all the time. So then the true"condition" of any group, ours included, has to be the nature of God. And the nature of God is love, eternal, forever and ever expanding with no limits whatsoever. That means that which is immaterial as well as that which is material. So the truth of any person or group then has to be the unlimited abundance of the Infinite. That includes all the production, distribution and consumption of goods and services and anything else we can think of. We are limited only by what we believe to be the truth of us. We're already working on a "first draft" of the 2014 budget, so we'll keep everyone informed as the Council has a chance to review and amend it. A final budget will be available for public review in November and will be approved before the end of the year.
