I hope you are enjoying this summer as much as I am.



Come from love in all you do! That is Kathy Batten's philosophy condensed from her eclectic spiritual search since leaving the Catholic Church at 18. In 2010, a friend asked Kathy if she would like to try out a place she found on the internet. It happened to be the Portland Center for Spiritual Living. At the first service at PCSL she knew she was where she belonged. After taking the *Foundations* class in 2011, "all my random beliefs were pulled together in one set of concepts under Science of Mind."

Kathy retired in 2009 after being "led" to retire early at 62. Her working career was varied and included quality manager, technical writer, planner/scheduler, manufacturing supervisor, and a lot of project management work which was rewarding but stressful.

When I asked her where the most interesting place she has visited, she was very clear, Amsterdam. She worked as an intermediary between a plant in Holland and the base plant in the US for a number of years. She loved the people she worked with who were "so much more laid back than I at the time."

Kathy isn't a hobby person but spends her time supporting women to change their lives. Family connections matter to her. When she isn't helping women or being a family person, reading is a passion. She enjoys self-help books and mysteries but skips the romance novels. In her spare time, she is on the CORE Council at PCSL.

THOUGHTS: BREATHE BY REV. SHARON LEE FOLEY

Thirty women from PCSL gathered at Silver Falls Conference Center in June for our ninth annual Celebrating Spirit as Woman retreat. It is a beautiful experience that seems to have a life of its own, each year seeming to build on the previous one to create a community within a community. In our philosophy we teach that there is only One and it is love. This is the experience that is shared at this retreat and it occurs to me to wonder how we as a community of women and the larger PCSL community can live this way for longer than four days once a year.

When we are at Silver Falls we set the intention to show up, to listen, to love. We commit to being in the moment. Something happens as we do this. We begin to exhale. We begin to be here now. We remember who we are. We reflect that back to each other. The environment of safety, warmth and love is palpable. It spoils us. We want this all the time. This feeling of oneness, of unity and harmony.

The thing is – it's not geography. It's not the time of year. It's us – the truth of who we are, that when we let it, just seems to emerge on its own. We just need to allow ourselves to be. Our assignment is just to show up and be fully present. There is a Sufi saying, "Breathe. You can do this." Take the time to breathe.

CORE COUNCIL UPDATE: BY DIANE THOMAS, CHAIR

The CORE Council has met twice since our last Newsletter. Here are updates about a few of our projects:

The new **heating and air conditioning system** is a go! Many thanks to those of you who contributed to this capital project. We've now raised enough money to order and install the new system to heat and cool our sanctuary quietly. We're working with the contractor now for installation dates and the new system may be working in time to "cool down" some of the typical August heat. We still need to raise about \$1,500.00 more to finish our cooling solution for upstairs. If you're interested in helping to cool down our kids, classes and office (and minister), please contact anyone on the Council with your gift or pledge.

We took a re-look at our **budgets** based on decreased tithing during the first half of the year. The budget team decided that we're still close enough to our revenue estimates that no changes are warranted at this time. We will review the budget again in September. We don't want to cut services for our Congregation (such as music, Sunday child care or other essentials) unless a clear trend of lowered giving is in evidence. Respectfully, we ask that our Membership see if they are on board with their pledges so far this year for regular contributions to the Center. Remember that if you need to adjust your annual pledge just give us a call so we can adjust our records. It really helps with the budget process if we know what to expect and we'll keep you posted if we don't catch up with our revenues in the next few months.

In the **maintenance** department we had the parking lot re-coated and re-stripped for safety and longevity. We also finished an audit with the Fire Marshall and are now in complete compliance.

We've finished scheduling and preliminary planning of many of our **fall events**, including: classes and workshops, October's "Partners in Prosperity" program, holiday services and events.

2013 continues to be a year of growth. Our Sunday services are well attended and our building is in great shape. Contact any of our council members with comments and questions. We're always available to you.
